I am 16 years-old. I live with my mother and 2 younger siblings. We have different fathers. My father is not in my life. The youngest sibling is involved with her father and family. My other sibling doesn't have a relationship with his father either, just his family. I am jealous of my little sister because she has a relationship with her father. Sometimes I take my anger out on her because of it.

My mother was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis when I was 11. As a result, she cannot work. She receives a disability check monthly. We also receive a link card. We live in a housing project. It is not the safest but it is home. Our rent is really cheap and I have my own room. When I grow up, I plan to live in the projects like my mother did when she was growing up.

I hate school. I want to drop out but I can't because I am too young. I am in Special Education. I am in the 10th grade at a High School. I hate it. I don't like being seen in those classes because people think I am slow. My reading is very low but I am good in Math. I can't stand my teachers. I don't like them and they don't like me.

I also have a disability. I have seizures all the time. I also receive a disability check. I never get any money except to pay the cell phone bills for me and my mother. My mom and I don't get along. She puts me down and calls me names. She likes her other children more than she likes me. I hate her. I wear tight clothes to get attention. I have sex with several grown men. I want to get pregnant so I can have someone to love me. I have had several STD's. I know I won't die or anything. As long as they are cured, I don't care.
